WNA Uniform Policy

All children are encouraged to wear school uniform to help foster a sense of belonging to the school community.

WNA has few expectations for uniform and does not differentiate between branded and non-branded items. Families in receipt of Pupil Premium are provided with free uniform.

Equality and Inclusion

WNA is aware of its obligations under the [Human Rights Act 1998](#) and the [Equality Act 2010](#) and is willing to allow for some individual variations to policy, where necessary to avoid indirect discrimination.

Religion or beliefs

WNA is sensitive to the needs of different cultures, races and religions and act reasonably in accommodating these needs, without compromising important school policies, such as school safety or discipline.

Complaints and challenges to school uniform policy

Disputes about school uniforms should be pursued in accordance with the school's complaints policy.

WNA School Uniform

Uniform consist of a bottle green sweatshirt or cardigan, a white or green polo shirt, grey trousers, skirt or pinafore or a green checked dress. All children require a book bag.

All children also need wellies, a change of clothes and PE kit: black or bottle green shorts, a white t-shirt and plimsolls in a drawstring bag. These items are kept in school and sent home half termly. ***Please ensure all uniform is named.***

Indoor Uniform

- Bottle green sweatshirt (with or without WNA Logo)
- White or green polo shirt
- Grey trousers/Skirt, joggers or jeans.
- Uniform can be ordered from the school office or directly from Tots to Teams.
- Slippers or plimsolls are to be worn inside.

Outdoor Clothing

All children will be outside for at least part of every day, and take part in Outdoor Learning each week. Warm clothing and wellies are essential. Waterproofs will be provided by school. Each child should have:

- A warm coat or fleece
- Wellington boots
- Hat / Gloves
- Long hair should be tied back.

If parents have any queries or concerns about school uniform, they should speak to the class teacher, the Headteacher or the School Business Manager.
